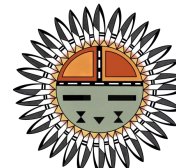

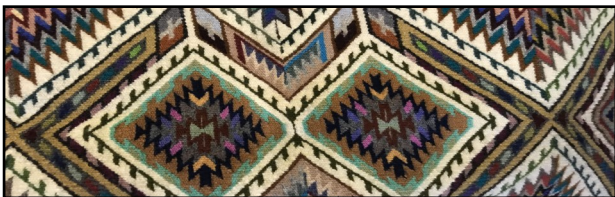

### 4 Navajo Rug and Indian Art Auction

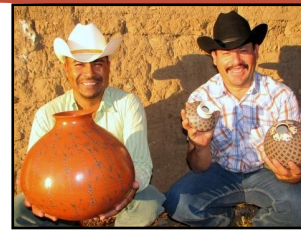
Day-of preview is from 9 AM to 11:30. All the auction action begins at noon. Free admission and free to register as a bidder.

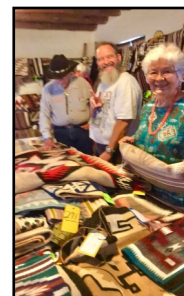
