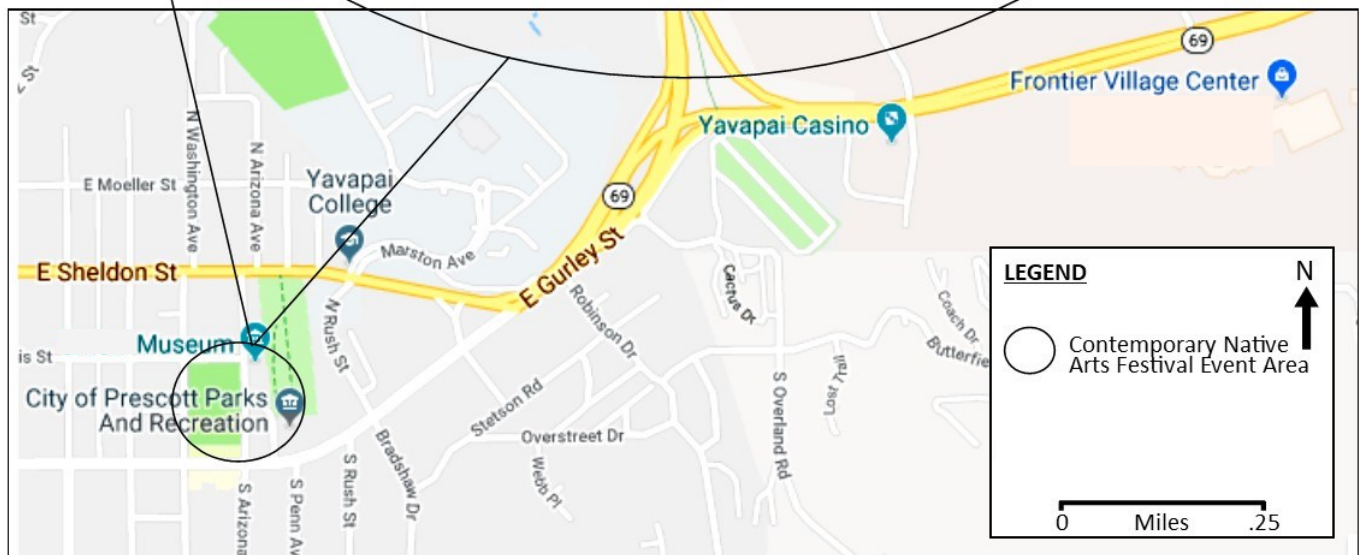
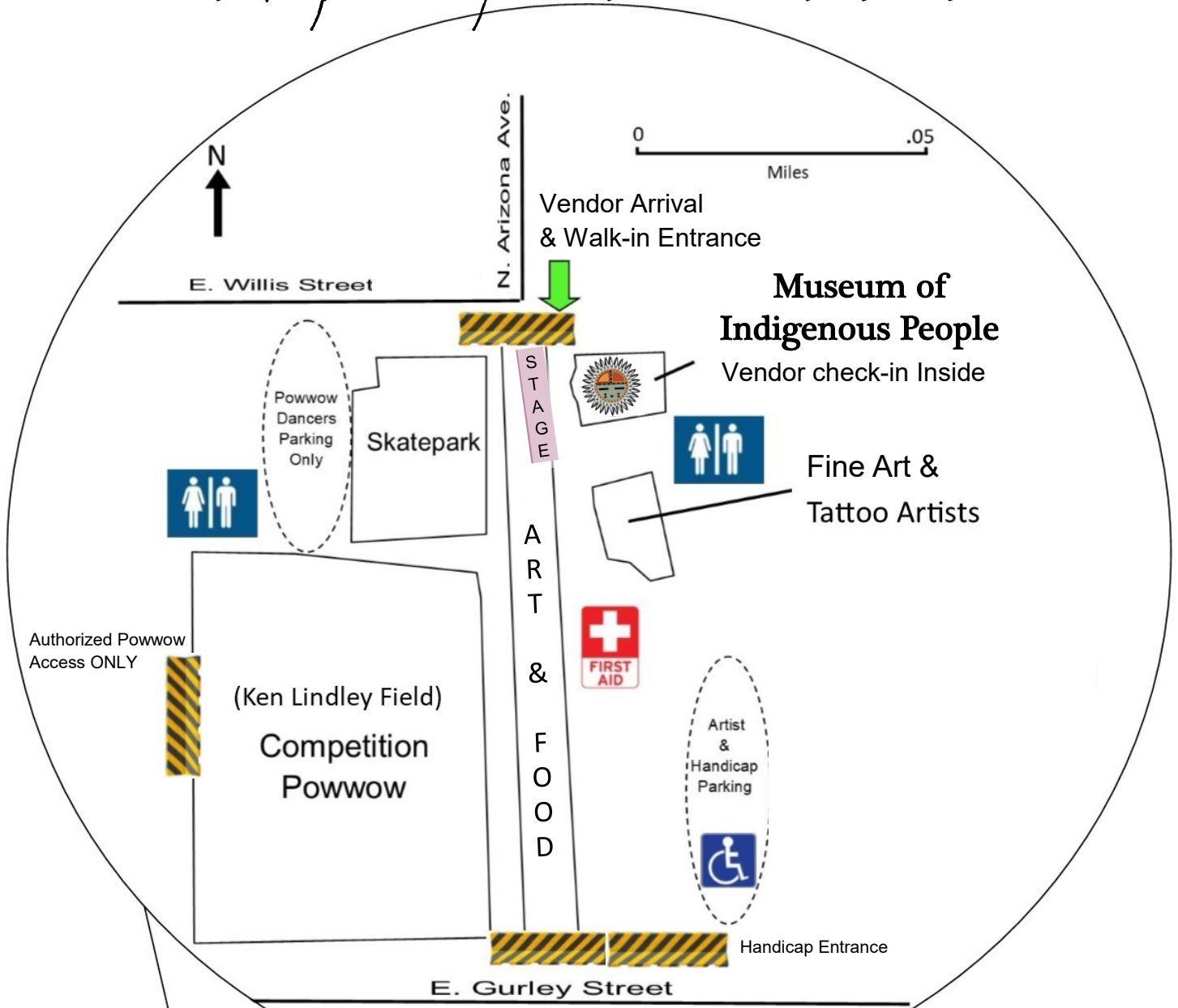

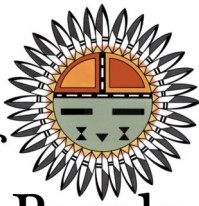

Artist exhibits will be located along North Arizona Avenue. Skateboard artists will be located in front of the skatepark, where there will be skating demonstrations. Tattoo artists and fine artists will be located in the Pueblo Building of the museum campus to insure privacy for tattoo artists, and safety for the art. Performances will occur in a band shell on Arizona Avenue, with spoken word presentations, musical performances, a magician, and dance performances throughout the weekend. The Mr. and Miss Southwest Two-Spirit Pageant will be held on the second day in the Grace Sparks Activity Center. The powwow of the Granite Mountain Gourd Society will be held on the beautifully maintained grass field at Ken Lindley Park both Saturday and Sunday.

**No canopy stakes are permitted, so remember to bring your weights!**

### **Eligibility**

ALL Native American artists and fine crafts persons are welcome. All work MUST be original in design and concept and created by the Native artist. NO items made from commercial kits, prefabricated forms or molds may be displayed or sold. Mass produced and imported items are NOT allowed.

### **Promotion**

Event and artist promotion will take place through extensive local and regional advertising. This will include TV, radio, newspapers, various community and statewide publications, mailings, social media, and banners.

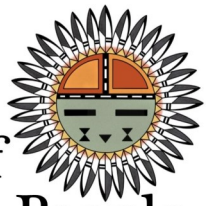

TOBACCO, INDIAN MASCOT TEAM CLOTHING OR ALCOHOL***

- No selling of feathers from birds of prey.
- Security will be provided each night after the event, although **Exhibitors leave their work at their own risk, and the museum is not responsible for any loss or theft.**
- Booths **MUST** remain open during Festival hours.
- Exhibitors are prohibited from distributing literature of, or promoting any religious, fraternal, political or commercial organization unless approved by the museum in advance. Literature regarding the artist or craft person's work or gallery affiliation is permitted.
- All items must be handcrafted (or designed by) by the artist (VENDOR). Factory reproduced designs on ready-wear apparel are considered to be "resale" and are not permitted.
- **NO RESALE ITEMS.**
- A portable fire extinguisher is strongly recommended for each booth.
- If you need power, bring a generator to assure that you have power available.
- Set up is on asphalt. CNAF is an outdoor event; artists provide their own awnings or easy-ups for comfort and weather protection. **BRING YOUR OWN CANOPY WEIGHTS.**
- Arts and Craft vendors will not be allowed to sell food or drinks from their booth.
- Please do not bring your pets with you.
- The marketplace follows federal rules and guidelines provided by the Indian Arts and Crafts Act (a truth-in-advertising law). Under this act, you must provide the museum a photocopy of your Tribal Enrollment showing that you are an enrolled member of a federal or state-recognized tribe, or evidence that you are a "certified Indian Artisan" by a recognized tribal organization.
- This is a drug and alcohol free event.
- **No stakes are permitted are permitted on the powwow grounds or surrounding field.**
